FSM & PUPIL PREMIUM

Have your circumstances changed recently? If so, have you applied for Pupil Premium and Free School Meals?

The benefits of Free School Meals & Pupil Premium

FSM & Pupil Premium attract many benefits for families, including supermarket vouchers for school holidays and access to funded places on the Devon Holiday Activity & Food Programme (HAF).

Financial support for your child at school

The school receives extra funding to be able to support your child. We can use this funding to help families with expenses for things like school reduced price trips, residentials and music lessons.

Apply for FSM to be automatically eligible for Pupil Premium

Parents must apply through the Citizen Portal on the Devon County Council website: https://www.devon.gov.uk/support-schools-settings/administration-and-finance/administration/free-school-meals/

The application is quick and easy and will result in you getting an instant decision. Children in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 must still apply to secure Free School Meals up to the end of Year 6. Even if your child is in R, Y1 or Y2 and has universal free school meals, you still need to apply for Pupil Premium to receive all other benefits, and to continue to receive FSM after Y2.

Eligibility

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed, your child may qualify for FSM & Pupil Premium

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS).
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA).
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income that does not exceed £16,190).
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).

Years 3 and 4 Dental Visit

On Monday Years 3 & 4 enjoyed a fun and very informative talk about dental health from the Dental Health Team. The children found out all about teeth and how to look after them.





Year 5

Year 5 have had a very busy week, with two exciting experiences. First, we went to Watermeadow Grange and shared some of our WW2 work with the residents. We were also lucky enough to hear about their experiences during the war. One of the residents told us about their school playground being used for air-raid shelters! Thank you to Miss Greygoose for organising and Mrs Follet for accompanying Mr Elliott and well done to all the children for their curiosity and their questions.

We have also had Julia from the Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue team to come and speak to the children about fire safety. They were so engaged and knew a lot already, which was reassuring!
