
End of Term

Weekly Class News

Little Acorns

What a busy and collaborative week you have had Little Acorns. It has been brilliant to hear you using so many rhyming words and exploring our early weighing activities. What fantastic story tellers you are also becoming, it is wonderful how you have all been joining in with our Dear Zoo story. Brilliant learning Little Acorns!

Big Acorns

You have been amazing this week Big Acorns as you have begun to develop your own Dear Zoo ideas, you have shared some brilliant adjectives. It has been wonderful to see how well and confidently you are applying your writing skills. You have explored and talked very well about our weighing activities, making great comparisons and working very well together to balance the scales. Thank you for also being such kind and considerate friends this week, you are all really helping each other with your learning.

Year 1

On Monday, Year 1 celebrated World Down Syndrome Day (WDSD). We marked the occasion by wearing odd socks. Each child completed a colouring sheet to display in their windows in order to raise awareness. Lucas shared a wonderful piece of artwork which he created with his family.

Our tadpoles are really starting to thrive. We have been observing them and looking closely to notice any changes. This week, we added rocks to their tank in preparation for them becoming frogs!

Year 2

This week in Year 2 the children have begun to think creatively about innovating the story of Orion and the Dark. For this they have needed to make links to their own experiences and emotions. We can't wait to get writing next week! Continuing our theme of Multiplicative Reasoning, the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about division and how to represent this with concrete resources and pictorially. Our problem solving session allowed the children to really show their learning off!

In their Wednesday afternoon session with Mrs Ostrer, the children have created beautiful group collages to reflect their goals and aspirations.

I can't believe we are heading into the final week before Easter. This coming week is going to be egg-cellent with lots of RE, Art and creative writing!

Year 3

This week in Year 3 we've been going round in circles, or turning in circles to be precise. Clockwise and anti-clockwise quarter and half turns have lead us to learning about right angles. We've discovered right angles all over the classroom and in 2D shapes - they are everywhere! In Literacy we've started planning our poems about a journey down the River Exe and next week we'll be writing and recording them. A real highlight has been our Tag Rugby P.E. lessons where we have been learning about running with the ball, passing and tagging. What a busy week!

Year 4

Well, Year 4..... this has been such a positive and successful week! We have been real poets and mathematicians. The progress you have made in your learning has been visible straight from Monday, and every day you have built on your knowledge and understanding, step by step. Your use of and understanding about mathematical language and terminology has leapt forward. And we cannot wait to read your poetry next week: mums and dads, look out for a recorded recital at the end of term! On top of this, we have some beautiful posters complete for the Topsham Garden and Allotment Society Garden Show. Well done Year 4- such a great week of learning!

Year 5

This week, we have been working really hard on division calculations and you have tried extremely hard with this. Well done for being resilient and for bouncing back when you have found your work challenging. You have all made links with the times table facts, which has been really impressive. I have enjoyed reading your character descriptions based on the animation we have watched and have written some great pieces of writing using 'show not tell' and dialogue. We have also started to think about how we could develop our outside areas. Well done Year 5.

Year 6

Year 6 have worked exceptionally hard on their maths learning this week. They have investigated angles: bouncing back when they made a mistake and using making links to help them estimate angles. The children have been so enthusiastic about their learning and have shown great curiosity and questioning. In Literacy, they have continued to practise using 'show not tell' and dialogue within their writing and have analysed the impact on the reader. At the beginning of the week, we planted lots of different seeds and have loved watching them begin to grow. Keep an eye out on the Google Classroom stream over the Easter holiday for updates!
