The other child looked straight at me and said, "So do you then go into your office and eat sweets all day because you have nothing to do?" I started laughing and so did they. I asked if they thought I did do this, and they said no but it was OK for me to eat sweets on the weekend- good advice.

As I met with my Finance Officer yesterday, we couldn't help but laugh out loud as we watched some Year 4s totally immersed in their play and one shouting, right outside the window, "Wait, pass me my jet pack" and then sped off across the playground. Brilliant!

Today I was fortunate enough to be in Key Stage 2 where children were reading and as I stopped to talk to some of them, one child just quietly reached out to hold my hand. It felt like a gift and one they would have no awareness they had given me, their warm hand in mine.

We are so happy our children are back with us.

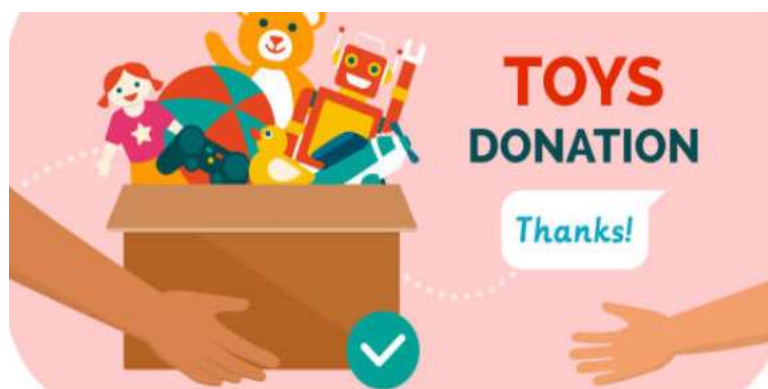
